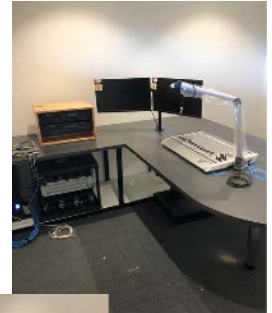


TRAINING SESSION

Roger Peake, Jim Harris, Paul Napier, John Vincent assembling the racks. It all came together successfully.

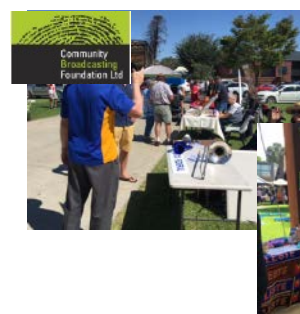


We now have a kitchen. Looks great!

Freesia is one of the best to grow for a perfumed cut flower. Dutch Iris make a great display of blues and yellow. Anemone have a lovely display of blue, red and white flowers. They're great for cut flowers and will come up each year, so good value. Have a good look at the variety on display and try something different this year.

In March I went to the International Flower Show in Melbourne, which has not been on for the last 2 years, so it was good to be able to go this year. Lots of lovely flowers and displays to see.
